SLIDES (100 points: 7 slides minimum)

- Introduction (slide #1) (This slide does not need to have 5 full sentence bullet points)
 - Name of entrepreneur
 - Business founded
 - Your name
 - Image (business logo if possible)
- Why your selected your entrepreneur (slide #2)
 - Brief explanation of why you selected this business and entrepreneur
 - What initially made you interested in this entrepreneur?
 - Do you currently buy products/services from this business?
 - Are you highly impressed by their business strategies? What are they?
 - Where do you see this business 10 years from now?
- Biography of entrepreneur(s) (slide #3)
 - History of entrepreneur prior to originating business (home life, city born and raised, childhood accomplishments, struggles, victories)
 - Experience prior to originating business (education, previous work experience)
 - Preliminary interest of business concept (why did he/she go into business?)

• Background and history of business (slide #4)

- When and where did this business begin?
- Types of products and services offered today and past years
- Concepts that proved to be crucial in success of business (ie: 24-store hours, customer discounts, location, inventory efficiencies, entertainment)
- Similar concepts that are currently used in other businesses today
- Community involvement (ie: charity donations scholarships, etc.)
- Store expansion (locations)

• Business Goals and Objectives (slide #5)

- Current projects and/or future goals the business is presently seeking to accomplish or currently experimenting (ie: Going Green, product expansion, etc.)
- Current accomplishments
- Business mission statement (see teacher if needed)

• **Reflection (slide #6)**

- What successful concepts from your entrepreneur would you implement in your own business?
- What would you do differently if you were the entrepreneur?
- Where do you feel the direction of the business is heading? What suggestions do you have for its future?
- Works cited (slide #7) This slide does not need to have 6 full sentence bullet points
 - Listing of websites/sources that were used to gather information (at least 3 sources)
